**15. Course aims:**

Acquiring of new knowledge about organic idioms of central and south Slavic area and training for independent research in the field of dialectology.

**16. Learning outcomes:**

Students are expected to know, understand and be able to do the following after successful completion of the learning process:

- on the basis of linguistic characteristics differentiate speech affiliations to specific dialect,
- point out differences between dialects and voice types,
- compare characteristics of voice types, subdialects and dialects,
- Connects the theoretical knowledge of the dialects on concrete examples of speech,
- determines origin of certain forms of the dialects,
- analyze linguistic characteristics in different dialects.

**17. Course content:**

Dialectology as a scientific discipline.

Basic theory of linguistic geography.

Urban dialectology.

Historical and synchronic dialectology.

Development of central-southern Slavic DIASYSTEM.

Stokavian, Kajkavian, Cakavian and Torlak dialect.

The Bosnian- Herzegovinian dialects and other dialects of central-southern Slavic DIASYSTEM.

Methodology of dialectological research. Analysis of texts in various dialects.

**18. Learning methods:**

Method of oral presentation, discussions, explaining, showing methods, heuristic methods - combined with different activities.

**19. Assessment methods:**

After half of the semester, students take the writing test (first partial examination). The maximum number of points is 40. After finishing the semester they have second writing test for the rest of course (second partial examination), for which they also receive 40 points.

For continuous activity in lectures and exercises throughout the semester, the student can achieve from 0 to 20 points.

In order for the student to pass the subject he or she must achieve a minimum of 54 points.

**20. Assessment components:**

Final grade is based on the total number of points the student acquired during the semester, and according to the quality of the acquired knowledge and skills; it has a maximum of 100 points, and is determined according to the following scale:
