Written assessment – test

Oral assessment – orally

For the knowledge assessment the following methods will be used:

- Written and
- Oral

Written method includes a written assessment (test). The assessment will be realized through questions and answers from the course content. The results will be announced after the realization of lectures and practice classes. The minimum number of points to pass the written exam is 26.

The oral method will be applied for those students who do not achieve the number of 26 points at written exam, and for those students who want to get a higher grade through oral assessment. Those students who do not achieve the result of 26 points at written assessment are obliged to attend the oral part of the exam. Students will be tested after the course is completed. There are 10 questions in the test, each question is 5 points. Therefore, one can get fifty points for ten questions. Students who get between 26 and 50 points at the written part do not have to attend the oral exam. Students will be informed about the test 15 days in advance. The maximum number of points at written exam is 50, and the students who get at least 26 points have passed the exam. The oral part of the exam will be performed on the basis on several questions from the course curriculum within 15-30 minutes. The maximum number of points at oral exam is 50, and the minimum is 26.

20. Assessment components:

The final grade is based on the maximum number of points a student earned by meeting pre-exam duties and by passing the exam, and according to the quality of acquired knowledge and skills, and amounts to total of 100 points. The final grade is established according to the following scale:
