**15. Course aims:**

- The social and political thought in Bosnia and Herzegovina through the history is not unknown but it is not enough scientifically absolved, so the students through the educational process, using available literature, need to get to know, who are prominent Bosnian intellectuals from different time periods which thought of BiH as their homeland and which ideas they spread.
- The history of spiritual production, especially in literature, in this period is not covered by oblivion, so students should be referred to the literature available and motivate them to further research.
- Point out students who are the intellectuals and scholars of Bosnia and Herzegovina and their work shake away from oblivion.
- Due to the prevailing prejudices towards spiritual production in Bosnia at the time of Ottoman and Ausorg-Hungarian rule, political thought did not reach the wider public, so that through social learning mechanisms could participate in public education and the formation of national consciousness.

**16. Learning outcomes:**

Acquiring knowledge in the field of social and political thought in Bosnia and Herzegovina by studying the available literature of prominent Bosnian-Herzegovinian intellectuals whose manuscripts are published through the history of BiH. Let students know who BiH intellectuals and scientists and their works are shaking away from oblivion.

- The legitimacy of the government and political conformism characterology and apology of Bosniaks and Islamm immigration policy critic, the conception of the Bosniac, Mehmed - Beg Kapetanovic Ljubušak,
- The politics as cultural politics, sociology of the Muslim community, the concept of the Bosniac, homeland, patriotism and Islam, the state legal status of BiH, Safvet - Basagic
- Radical criticism of the government, panserbianism, consequences, agrarian question, the national legal projections, Petar Kocic,
- The concept of socialization, socialism as a necessity, socialism and the Private property, socialism, revolution and evolution, about serbs and All-Serbian unification, anti-Semitism and Islam, Vaso Pelagic.
