**15. Course aims:**

- to understand the social phenomena, processes and relationships in the settlement - the city and the village as urban and rural territorial social communities
- to understand the social structure of the city and the village and the position and role of the individual and the social groups as well as social organizations and institutions in them
- to understand the forms of thought and behavior in the social environment of the city and the village
- to recognize the presence of the position, the role and influence of certain forms of social consciousness in the city and the village (religions, morals, cultures, etc.)
- to understand the importance of development - economic, city and village development of infrastructure, provision of education, health care, traffic development, employment of people (young people in particular)
