 - international legal regulation of local self-government
 - Comparative experiences of contemporary local self-government systems and experiences of transition countries
 - achieved the degree of local self-government reform in Bosnia and Herzegovina
2. Develop analytical and critical abilities to evaluate the local self-government system or individual segments and develop the ability to create new ideas, Get acquainted with new methods of practical work

16. Learning outcomes:

Obtain the necessary knowledge of legal theoretic, international legal comparative information on local self-government as well as the new reform achievements of local self-government in Bosnia and Herzegovina

The ability to analyze the degree of development of local self-government in Bosnia and Herzegovina in comparison with international standards (European Charter of Local Self-Government) through a comparative analysis of some local self-

Through seminar work, they have the opportunity to express their analytical abilities, critical observations, the ability to interpret and conclude, and will especially be able to demonstrate their creative

17. Course content:

1. The concept of local self-government and the legal theory of the position of local self-government
2. Democracy and local self-government
3. Political aspects of local community governance, legal aspects of local community governance (constitutional, sub-legal aspects)
4. The European Charter on Local Self-Government and the System of Local Self-Government experience of more developed countries
5. History of local self-government in Bosnia and Herzegovina, principles of the local legal system of local self-government in Bosnia and Herzegovina
6. Structure of the local self-government system (jednotipnost, višetipnost, jednnospenostost, višestepenost, pravni režim metropola
7. Local government tasks / responsibilities, types of work, local self-government organization
8. Local self-government bodies, public service in local self-government, acts of self-government
9. Local electoral systems, citizens and local self-government, local decision-making processes, local self-government funding, relations of central self-government bodies,

18. Learning methods:

Lectures using multimedia tools, active learning techniques and active participation and discussion of students
Simulation of decision making process in municipal councils
Simulation of the relationship between organs, citizens, public services, non-governmental organizations

19. Assessment methods:

Analysis of concrete cases from practice (students will choose a concrete case from the practice that will analyze critically to discuss with the teacher and give a conclusion with a meticulous view of solving that question).
Seminar work (the student will choose, in agreement with the lecturer, one topic that will assimilate the legal theoretical international legal comparative and experiential aspect).
Research work (the student will select, in agreement with the lecturer, one topic to explore in his unit of local self-government to analyze critically observe and draw conclusions with his own observations of research results).

20. Assessment components:

The evaluation of the exam based on the total number of points and it contains a maximum of 100 points. It is determined according to the following scale:

- attendance at lectures - 5 points
- student activity - 5 points.
- seminar work - 20 points.
- research work - 20 points.
- analysis of concrete cases from practice - 20 points.
