15. Course aims:

Getting acquainted with and adopting basic scientific methods as well as introducing planned scientific phases from the methodology of social legal research.

16. Learning outcomes:

Obtain the necessary knowledge of scientific research and their conduct in the planning science phases Through research papers, they have the opportunity to present their research capabilities, critical observations, the ability to interpret and conclude and will be particularly able to demonstrate their creative abilities.

17. Course content:

Determining the Concept and Role of the Methodology of Social and Legal Sciences, The Epistemological Methodological Principles of Scientific Work, The Relationship between Methodology and Science, The Relationship between Methods and Theory, The Concept of Social Science and Social Subject, The Institutional Character of the Science Concept and Types of Scientific Explanations, Methodological Approach in Social Sciences, Fundamentalism and The concept of the legal method, the concept of legal technique, the methods of applying the law, the methods of applying the general norm to the concrete case.

18. Learning methods:

Lectures using multimedia tools, active learning techniques and active participation and discussion of students
Simulation of decision making process in municipal councils
Simulation of the relationship between organs, citizens, public services, non-governmental organizations

19. Assessment methods:

Analysis of concrete cases from practice (students will choose a concrete case from the practice that will analyze critically to discuss with the teacher and give a conclusion with a meticulous view of solving that question).
Seminar work (the student will choose, in agreement with the lecturer, one topic that will assimilate the legal theoretical international legal comparative and experiential aspect).
Research work (the student will choose, in agreement with the lecturer, one topic that will explore collective rights and analyze critically observe and draw conclusions from their own observations of research results).

20. Assessment components:

The assessment of the exam based on the total number of points the student has obtained by fulfilling the pre-requisites and passing the exam and it contains a maximum of 100 points and is determined according to the following scale:

- attendance at lectures - 5 points.
- student activity - 10 points.
- research work - 55 points.
