**15. Course aims:**

- Creation of highly educated experts for work in the agricultural sector, according to the applicable legislative norms
- Prevent knowledge in carrying out business activities, self-employment, administrative and professional services
- Resolving problems in the domain of agricultural production, with the interpretation of valid legislation and good agricultural practices

**16. Learning outcomes:**

- To know and explain the terms of legal regulations related to primary production and food safety
- Write and disclose the participants responsibilities in implementing the legislation
- To identify and apply the most important legal provisions of the Common Agricultural Policy
- Insert legal regulations for certain types of agricultural products
- Solve different problems in practice or primary food production according to legislative provisions and regulations

**17. Course content:**

Detailed introduction to the subject content, purpose, teaching methods, examination methods, literature, etc. Introduction, EU History, Structure and Institutions. International Aspects of Food Regulations and International Regulatory Agencies. EU policy in the field of agricultural and food products production. "Codex Alimentarius". Regulations on the production, processing and distribution of agricultural products. Harmonization of national regulations with EU regulations. Principles of Good Agricultural Practice (DPP).

**18. Learning methods:**

- Lecture with the use of multimedia resources, active learning techniques, with active participation of students in the discussion
- Consultations with the subject teacher and/or assistant

**19. Assessment methods:**

The testing of the knowledge will be done through two partial tests from the respective teaching units, after the first half of the semester (first partial test T1) and at the end of the semester (second partial test T2). The single test consists 20 questions, each question is 1 point. Both tests put all the students on the course at the same time, thereby achieving the level of knowledge that is being tested and the conditions under which a student passes an exam. The final exam may be written and / or oral, depending on the number of points you have earned in the pre-exam obligations.

At the final exam, students who have won the required number of points can enter a final grade. Students who have passed a partial test put the rest of the remaining (unbeaten) part on the final exam. Students who have not passed a partial test, on the final, or corrective or additional correction, pass the entire exam, which contains the questions of both partial tests).

Students who have not passed the exam in the academic year when they first attend the course will be subject to the remaining test assignments by the current Act of the University in Tuzla.

The assessment of the exam is based on the total number of points the student has obtained by fulfilling the pre-exam obligations (minimum 28 points) and the completion of the final exam (minimum 26 points) according to the quality of the acquired knowledge and skills and contains at least 54 points or a maximum of 100 points.

**20. Assessment components:**

The grade of the exam is based on the total number of points the student has obtained by fulfilling the pre-exam and taking the exam and is determined according to the following scale:
