15. Course aims:

The goal of the module is for the student to acquire knowledge about the structure of the human body, but in such a way that the systematic and topographical organization of the human body is seen exactly, three-dimensionally, and thus permanently and logically understood.

16. Learning outcomes:

The student will apply the acquired knowledge and skills in integral medicine. These are connected horizontally with preclinical disciplines, and vertically with diagnostic and clinical disciplines. In this way, the profession of clinical medicine will, for the most part, practically apply based on medical sciences.

17. Course content:

The content of the course includes material from the systematic, topographic, and functional anatomy of the human body, visceral organs, the heart and vascular system, the nervous system, and sensory organs. This will create a solid basis for other biomedical disciplines, which are a part of this study.

18. Learning methods:

Visual presentations of lectures are held in the amphitheater of the Faculty of Medicine. Students actively participate in the lecture. Consultations are carried out in the Anatomy classroom, as needed and at the request of students.

19. Assessment methods:

Regularity of class attendance: 5;

Engagement in classes: 10;

Test during the course: 40 (20 questions of two points each; from 36 to 40 points – passed). Total: 55 points.

Final exam: Oral part of the final exam: CNS, PNS, Organa sensum. Three questions: 15 points, all total 70 points - score 6. Questions for a score from 6 to 10: CNS: 8 points (78 points - score 7) PNS: 8 points (86 points - score 8)

Organum visus: 7 points (93 points – grade 9); Organum statoacusticum: 7 points (100 points – grade 10).

Candidates who passed the test during the course:

Regularity of class attendance: 5;

Engagement in classes: 10;

Written part of the final exam: 40 (10 questions of four points each; 7 to 10 correct answers – 40 points). Total 55 points

The oral part of the final exam: Seven areas of two points each: 14 points; total: 69 points – grade 6; CNS: 8 points (77 – grade 7); Organa sensum 8 points (85 – grade 8); Head and neck 8 points (93 – score 9); Thorax, abdomen or pelvis (100 – score 10).

20. Assessment components:

The final achievement of a student, after all prescribed forms of knowledge assessment, is evaluated as follows:

< 55 points = 5 (fail)

55–64 points = 6 (satisfactory)

65–74 points = 7 (good)

75–84 points = 8 (very good)

85–94 points = 9 (excellent)

95–100 points = 10 (outstanding)
